Specific reference is also made to the Official Statement dated June 19, 2003 relating to the Commonwealth's Special Obligation Refunding Notes (Federal Grant Anticipation Note Program), 2003 Series A (the "2003 Official Statement"), to the Official Statement dated December 14, 2010 relating to the Commonwealth's Special Obligation Refunding Notes (Senior Federal Highway Grant Anticipation Note Program), 2010 Series A (the "Senior GANs Official Statement") and to the Official Statement dated December 14, 2010 relating to the Commonwealth's Federal Highway Grant Anticipation Notes (Accelerated Bridge Program), 2010 Series A (the "Accelerated Bridge Program Official Statement"), copies of which have been filed with the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board through its Electronic Municipal Market Access (EMMA) system. Capitalized terms not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed to such terms in the respective Official Statements.

This statement is of limited scope. It contains only an updating of certain financial information and operating data described below. The information set forth herein does not contain all material information concerning the Commonwealth's federal highway grant anticipation note program necessary to make an informed investment decision. This statement does not constitute an offer to sell or the solicitation of an offer to buy Commonwealth federal grant anticipation notes. This statement is submitted pursuant to various continuing disclosure undertakings relating to bonds that are subject to Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission and is intended to provide only the information necessary to conform to the requirements of said Rule 15c2-12.
